

HALLOWEEN Safety Tips



SAFETY FIRST

- Check reliable websites, such as the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, to see where registered offenders/predators live.
- Parents or trusted adults should accompany children and youth during trick-or-treating



DRIVERS

- Slow down and be on alert while driving through residential neighborhoods
- Adults going to a party— Make a plan, have a designated driver



FOR GREATER VISIBILITY...

- Add reflective tape to costumes and trick-or-treat bags
- Carry a flashlight while out trick-or-treating



TRICK-OR-TREATERS

- Stay in a group
- Only trick-or-treat at homes that have a porch light on
- Do not go into a stranger's home or get in their car



AFTER TRICK-OR-TREATING

- Examine candy to make sure it has not been tampered with
- Keep your pets safe— place candy, especially chocolate, out of reach or smell
